Biketrial UK exists in order to:

- Make it easier for riders to participate
- Promote the ideals of good citizenship through the disciplines inherent in sporting activity:
 - Sportsmanship
 - Self discipline
 - Personal responsibility
 - Co-operation
- Promote and further the sport of Biketrial in the United Kingdom
- Monitor and supervise the quality of National, Regional and Club events
- Represent British riders' interests at UCI World Events working with British Cycling

Aims and Objectives:

- To encourage growth of the sport, and therefore youth involvement, by developing and enabling systems for new groups/clubs to embrace
- To improve the quality of the Biketrial sport in the UK
 - providing venues of a quality appropriate for National Championship standard
 - providing facilities appropriate for National Championship attention
 - providing awards suitable for National Championship level
 - seeking new venues to take trials to the people
- To increase public interest and to raise media attention in order to encourage a growth of the importance of the sport in the UK
- To enhance Britain's standing in the World ranking of BikeTrial/Trials
- To work and co-operate with international event organisers and competitors to encourage international participation both at home and abroad (BIU and UCI)

Membership of the Biketrial UK Federation

Officers to be elected are Chairman and Administrator, and other positions as deemed necessary. Each Officer has one vote, with the Chairman holding the casting vote when required.

Each participating Biketrial UK Federation club may send two representatives to meetings and each club has two votes.
